The clinical program is founded upon the belief that opioid use disorder is treatable, and that those persons living with its effects are entitled to the best treatment available at the level of least intrusion in their lives. This care should reaffirm the individual's self-worth and inherent human dignity. Thus, the caregivers, the staff, must be caring, compassionate, and professionally competent; the facility in which the program is operated must be appropriately discreet, attractive and comfortable, as well as accessible and affordable.

Because opioid use disorder affects every aspect of patients' lives, a treatment program must also address every relevant aspect of patients' lives, from the physical to the metaphysical, the body to the spirit. For this reason, the formal treatment program includes not only medication, but also individual, family, and group counseling, and an introduction to the lifelong support a recovery program can offer. Services may also be provided for the significant other of someone with a substance use disorder, these programs are individualized and designed to meet the special needs of our varied clientele.
